## The Pioneer Cemetery Restoration Clinic, Lebanon, Ohio October 22, 2011

Sponsored by the Warren County Genealogy Society

This day-long clinic will empower participants providing them with the tools needed to document and preserve grave markers and to restore cemeteries. The clinic will demonstrate in step-by-step fashion how to preserve a cemetery with recommendations as to what lay people should and should not undertake.

In the workshop participants will learn the basics of gravestone repair and preservation: proper cleaning of gravestones, how to level stones, how to build new bases and how to repair broken stones. During the workshop and under the supervision of experienced professionals, participants will have the opportunity to work on actual grave markers.

A detailed handout is included that clearly describes many aspects of restoration and will guide you in the correct ways to approach preservation and conservation.

Saturday's all-day, in-cemetery clinic will cover the fundamentals of cemetery preservation and will cover in detail basic and advanced aspects of cemetery restoration.

The clinic will be conducted by preeminent restoration professionals, trained in the principles of grave marker restoration and graveyard conservation as established by and studied at the Association for Graveyard Studies in Greenfield, Massachusetts.

The City of Lebanon granted landmark status to the Pioneer Cemetery in order that the community may respect this consecrated ground and better understand and appreciate the pioneer settlers and the early history of Lebanon, Turtlecreek Township and the surrounding area.

"The Pioneer Cemetery is at the intersection of W. Main Street and West Street, six blocks west of the town square in Lebanon, Ohio. It encompasses an entire block and is comprised of two old church graveyards. No fence or barrier of any kind is known to have separated the two cemeteries.

"The Old Baptist Graveyard is on the north side. In 1811, the Baptists moved their church from a site east of Lebanon to what is now the northwest corner of the Pioneer Cemetery. It would remain a Baptist house of worship until 1860, when the church across from the cemetery entrance was built. As was the practice at that time, the churchyard was also used as the church graveyard." - John Zimkus, Education Director, Warren County Historical Society.

The clinic runs from 9 am-4 pm and includes extensive workshop materials. Cost is \$35.
