## Early Settlers of Warren County, Ohio

While "First Families of Warren County, Ohio" recognizes the original families in the county prior to 1802, this Early Settlers organization brings to the fore all of your kin who were established residents more than a hundred years back. Photography was devoled in this time era and many will have pictures to aid your children in identifying the many surnames that are actually connected to them.

### **Requirements for Membership:**

Only members of the Warren County Genealogical Society (WCGS) may apply for membership in "Earl Settlers of Warren County, Ohio" (ESWC). Applicants must complete this application form and submit proof of:

- 1. Their ancestry back to a Warren County resident who settled here prior to January 1, 1883, and
- 2. The residence of that Warren County pioneer prior to January 1, 1883.

Proof of ancestry shall be in the form of copies of legal documents and other records (- - see "Rules of Evidence") which clearly name the persons, their parents and spouses, the dates of the events, etc. Each generation in the direct lineage must have accompanying proofs and a notation of their source.

Applications fee of \$15.00 must accompany the completed papers and proofs. All applications will be reviewed by the Early Settlers Chairman and final approval by the Warren County Genealogical Society Board. Additional names & proofs can be added at a later date with no charge.

#### **Rules of Evidence**

- 1. Primary or collateral evidence from vital statistics, court house or other government records, Shaker, church and school records, etc. is considered usually to be excellent proof.
- 2. Secondary evidence such as census records, newspaper clippings, old letters, Bible or other family records, contemporary to the facts reported, is considered almost as authentic (as #1 items). However, copies of old letters, family records, etc. can be accepted as proof only for facts the writer of the record or letter would logically know of his own first-hand knowledge, and they cannot be accepted as proof if they were hearsay from other generations or from other sources.
- 3. Land transactions(deeds, warrants, grants, etc.) can only be accepted as evidence of settlement in Warren County if the record, or a subsequent record, actually states that the individual was "of Warren County" (by year of 1882 Beer's History of Warren County can be used to substantiate claims.)
- 4. Not accepted as proof are the following: circumstantial evidence or hearsay, oral or written or published family traditions, printed or manuscript genealogies, genealogical compilations, lineage papers from patriotic or hereditary societies.
- 5. If a document merely implies a fact, this is not considered proof. Examples are the expressions, "heirs" and "heirs-at-law", used in some probate records. These indicate different relationships in different states, and are not necessarily proof of direct descent. They could refer to nieces, nephews, cousins, and adopted children.
- 6. Female ancestors must be referred to and proved by their maiden names, rather than those of their spouses.
- 7. Additional applications for more than one pioneer ancestor do not require duplicate information or proof. Submit an ancestor chart to show the connecting lineage. Also reference should be made to the prior application papers and the ESWC number assigned to them.
