"Civil War Women: Soldiers & Spies"

The speaker will illustrate the roll that women played in the Civil War both as soldiers and spies with illustrations of selected women. She will discuss soldiers Sara Emma Edmonds and Jennie Rodgers both of whom dressed as men and served as soldiers during the Civil War. Their lives after the war were very contrasting. She will also discuss the confederate spy, Belle Boyd and the Union spy, Elizabeth Van Lew, who lived in Richmond, the Capital of the Confederacy. The speaker will also discuss the roles of other women in the Civil War as time permits.
